Introduction

Worsening marine environmental issues have drawn the attention of an increasing number of environmental organizations. But while it is understood that the environmental sector is growing, there has been no review of the number of marine environmental organizations and the contribution they make. Therefore Shanghai Rendu Ocean NPO Development Center has, as part of the Capacity Development and Network Building for Marine Environmental Protection NGOs in China project, carried out this thorough survey, examining the state of the sector and presenting its findings in this directory.

The Capacity Development and Network Building for Marine Environmental Protection NGOs in China project was initiated by Rendu, with funding from UNDP's Global Environmental Facility Small Grants Programme and support from the Heyi Institute and the Capacity Building and Assessment Center. The project aims to use offline training and online interaction to improve overall capacities in China's marine environmental organizations; and promote marine environmental protection through communication and partnerships between those organizations.

Of course, counting organizations and listing their achievements is not the ultimate aim of this directory. Nobody imagines that a single organization can undertake the huge task of protecting the oceans, and so cooperation is essential. Rendu hopes that this resource will allow organizations to exchange information more easily and form communities that can work together.

Scope and methodology

The aim of this directory is to provide a complete set of information, including all organizations that carry out work relevant to marine environmental protection – including foundations, social organizations, non-governmental non-profits, university student associations, state institutions and environmental groups which have registered as commercial entities – to show readers how organizations working on marine environmental protection in China, and even around the world, have developed. Unfortunately, problems contacting groups and missing information mean the directory still falls short of its aim.

We took a "big ocean" approach to gathering data, including organizations working on coastal wetlands, protection of seabirds and land reclamation – areas where land and sea meet. Once that scope had been determined we first collected information via the Internet, then attempted to reach organizations by mail and by telephone, asking them to provide information or to check information we had already collected. Limited staff and resources meant we could not contact every organization. We have therefore indicated which organizations have confirmed the accuracy of the information we present, and where information is not available fields have been left blank.

Categorizing Chinese marine environmental organizations

This edition of the directory improves on last year's, listing 231 organizations compared to 191 in 2016, with 53 new entries and 13 organizations removed. For the convenience of users, a more detailed system of categorization is used:

Organizations with "marine (海洋)" in their name or which work specifically on marine issues, are Chinese and are not foundations are classed as "Chinese marine environmental social groups";

Organizations which carry out work relevant marine environmental protection, are Chinese and are not foundations are classed as "Chinese marine environment-related social groups";

Student associations with "marine (海洋)" in their name or which work specifically on marine issues and are Chinese are classed as "Marine environmental student associations";

Student associations which carry out work relevant to marine environmental protection and are Chinese are classed as "Chinese marine environment-related student associations";

Chinese foundations which support the marine environmental sector are classed as "Chinese marine-related foundations";

International NGOs with projects in the Chinese marine environmental sector are classed as "International marine environment-related NGOs";

Other Chinese social groups which provide marine environmental organizations with resources and capacity building are classed as "Chinese supporting organizations";

Chinese government bodies, state institutions, universities and international organizations which support the development of marine environmental organizations and provide resources are classed as "Other organizations". Only contact details are listed for organizations in this category.

It also must be pointed out that this edition adds a "Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan Marine Environment-related Organization" category, with 14 organizations included, to help readers better understand the sector.




Figure 1: Fields in which Chinese marine environmental organizations work (2017 edition)

The fields in which an organization works are now classified – from a top-level classification of philanthropy, to environmental protection, to marine environment and marine environment-related, then to more specific fields such as marine pollution, marine ecological conservation, or capacity building, resource support and environmental education, then on to specific fields such as marine litter, noise, conservation of mangrove forests, etc.

For example, although Rendu also carries out work on environmental education and other fields, its main field of work is marine litter, and so the relevant entry in its listing reads: "Philanthropy – environmental protection – marine environment – marine pollution – marine litter".

An overview of Chinese marine environmental organizations:

data analysis

This directory lists 231 organizations working on the marine environment. These include 36 Chinese marine environmental social groups; 68 Chinese marine environment-related social groups; 21 Chinese marine environment student associations; 16 Chinese marine environment-related student associations; 13 Chinese marine-related foundations; 14 Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan marine environment-related organizations; 22 international marine environment-related NGOs; 5 Chinese supporting organizations; and 36 other organizations. Information was missing for 27 organizations: 13 Chinese marine environmental student associations; 10 Chinese marine environment-related student associations; 10 Chinese marine environment-related social groups; and 4 Chinese marine environmental social groups.




Figure 2: Chinese marine environmental organizations (2017 Directory)

In the following paragraphs a simple analysis of these organizations will be carried out by geographical distribution, date of foundation, type of registration, and annual income and expenditure.

Geographical distribution




Figure 3: Geographical distribution of Chinese marine environmental organizations (2017 Directory)


Subject of analysis: 209 marine environmental organizations: 36 Chinese marine environmental social groups; 68 Chinese marine environment-related social groups; 21 Chinese marine environment student associations; 16 Chinese marine environment-related student associations; 13 Chinese marine-related foundations; 14 Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan marine environment-related organizations; 5 Chinese supporting organizations; and 36 other organizations.

The data shows clear geographical characteristics: China's marine environment organizations are all located in eastern coastal provinces, and in particular on the south-east coast. In the 2014 edition of the directory the three provinces with the greatest number of organizations were Hainan, Guangdong and Fujian – all on China's south-east coast. In the 2015 edition, Hainan, Guangdong and Beijing had the greatest number of organizations, and there was no further change in the 2016 edition. In this 2017 edition the only change is that Guangdong now ranks above Hainan. It is worth noting that there is not a direct correlation with number of organizations and level of economic development – Shanghai is a very developed city, but it is not home to a higher number of organizations.

The directory shows that most organizations are active only in their local city, with some working across their home province and only very few working across provincial boundaries. This is due to the current legal environment, but also to limited capacities: most organizations lack the capacities or opportunities to run projects over a wider area.

Date of foundation

Subject of analysis: 140 Chinese marine environment organizations. Excluded are: 22 international marine environment-related NGOs; 36 other organizations; and 33 organizations for which this data was not available.



The statistics show that 17 Chinese marine environment organizations were founded before 1996, 6 of these in Hong Kong, Macau or Taiwan. The number of organizations founded each year steadily increased from this point, with 52 founded between 2011 and 2015, and 10 in 2016 and 2017. 60 of these organizations, almost half of the selection, were founded after 2010. This shows that overall Chinese marine environment organizations are still quite young, and the increasing level of awareness and attention to marine environmental issues.

Type of registration

Subject of analysis: 133 marine environmental organizations. These include mainland-registered Chinese marine environmental social groups; Chinese marine environment-related social groups; Chinese marine-related foundations; Chinese supporting organizations; and related public institutions. Not included are 22 international NGOs, 14 organizations from Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan, 37 student associations, and also 25 organizations for which this information was missing.




Figure 5: Type of registration (2017 Directory)

According to the directory data, the largest grouping is the 40 organizations registered as social organizations. There are 28 non-governmental non-profits. The public institutions category is a new addition for this edition, with 36 listed. The majority of organizations are registered as public institutions, social organizations or non-governmental non-profits, with the number of foundations and organizations with commercial registration accounting for a smaller proportion.

Annual income and expenditure

Subject of analysis: 25 Chinese marine environmental and marine environment-related social groups, and 5 Chinese marine-related foundations and supporting organizations provided budget data for 2017, forming the basis of our analysis. This data does reflect the financial circumstances of the organizations, however, and validity could be improved.




Figure 6: 2017 Income of Chinese marine environmental organizations

Of the 25 marine environmental organizations which provided annual income and expenditure data, 7 had annual income of less than 100,000 RMB, 7 of between 100,000 and 500,000 RMB, 4 of between 500,000 and 1,000,000 RMB, and 7 of over 1,000,000 RMB. This shows the uneven growth of Chinese marine environmental organizations, with some held back by lack of funds. Also, 7 of the 25 organizations had expenditures higher than income, with 4 of these having income of over 1,000,000 RMB.

The five marine-related foundations and supporting organizations which provided income and expenditure data all had both income and expenditure of over 1,000,000 RMB.

The directory also shows that most marine environmental organizations tend to work across a range of fields and have not yet focused their efforts on in-depth work on specific topics. This is due to resource shortages, forcing the organizations to look for any resources available and so to work on a more diverse range of issues, rather than being able to focus on one topic.

Overall, China's marine environmental sector is still developing. Organizations have limited capacities to act, communication networks between organizations have not yet formed, and there is a lack of generally-accepted norms. More effort is needed by all working in the sector. We hope to see bigger and better things!

Beijing Youyu Conservation and Sustainable Development Center is an NGO and thinktank focused on both the sustainable use of the oceans and fisheries and the protection of the ecology of the oceans and coasts. It works to raise public awareness about the marine environment and fishery resources; interprets humanity's relationship with the oceans in social, economic and cultural terms; provides scientific backing for decision-making by stakeholders; and works with diverse actors to promote capacity building in China's marine and freshwater reserves, the protection of aquatic life and the sustainable development of the aquaculture and fishing industries.
